We have begun renovations to our office, especially to the areas where some of our cats are housed awaiting adoption. We have made the cat rooms brighter and more organized, providing not only comfortable surroundings for the cats but also a nice place for our potential adopters to visit. We are especially proud of our wall of helping hands, which we hope will eventually include hand prints from all of our volunteers.

We have also been able to establish a vet-approved clinic and hire an in-house veterinarian. This allows us to perform spays and neuters right here in the office and to provide some necessary medical

services to all of our cats. We've also been able to make arrangements with a local kennel to take in some of our rescue dogs, enabling us to help more of our canine friends as well.

While we have made vast improvements, we still have a ways to go to fulfill the dreams of our generous donors and volunteers. BUILDING THE FUTURE FOR KAR

Kalamazoo Animal Rescue was founded in 1991 and has passed its first quarter-century of caring for needy animals in southwest Michigan. Throughout our existence as an organization, the overarching goal has been to provide the best care possible for needy and at-risk cats and dogs. As we dream about the future, building on our years of service to the community, we at the rescue look forward to even better opportunities to fulfill our mission and build a legacy of quality care for our furry friends.

Recently KAR has embarked on a long-range plan to improve our ability to give the dogs and puppies, cats and kittens who come to us from a variety of situations a second chance for "happily ever after." A few months ago I had a conversation with Hisham Saleh, our treasurer and an avid volunteer, about this vision for KAR's future. Many of the ideas he shared with me are already coming to fruition and additional opportunities have also occurred to expand our ability to bring hope to pets in need. Here are some highlights of our dreams for KAR and how they have been realized.

Although KAR originally functioned as a home-based rescue, with all

our dogs and cats cared for in foster homes, that model has limited how many animals we can help. The implementation of Kitty Kamp in our office facility offered an opportunity to house even more cats, while partnership with Derspinna Kennels provided the ability to take in a larger number of dogs. Kitty Kamp has

evolved slowly and its expansion has depended on donations of equipment and supplies. One of our dreams for the future included a plan to remodel the office and to provide space within the office that was more organized and easier to maintain. This has actually taken shape over the past few months, with improved housing and storage areas to support our in-house cat population. Whether in a cage or in one of our community rooms, each cat is given a clean, comfortable area to call home with plenty of fresh water and nutritious food. Quarantine space has also been created to separate cats with contagious illnesses from the general population.

Another goal was to reduce our medical care costs; and this, too, has come to fruition. One of our smaller rooms, which had formerly housed just a few cats, has been converted into a medical service facility, with care provided by our in-house veterinarian, Dr. Kathleen Corbett. Dr. Corbett's professional expertise has greatly enhanced our ability to provide treatment in the office, including spay/neuter surgeries. All the equipment needed to provide the sterile instruments for surgery has been installed and the medical room is kept secure. Any assistance provided by adult volunteers is directed by Dr. Corbett, who also supervises training.
